Amended Final Statement of Community Development Objectives and Projected Use of Funds

Program Years 2018-2024

Jefferson County, Alabama, and a consortium of municipalities located within the County (excluding Birmingham, Bessemer, Helena, Sumiton, and Hoover), received from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development annual grant for the 2018-2024 Program Years from the Annual Action Plan of the 2015 Five-Year Consolidated Plan and 2020 Five-Year Consolidated Plan. These are the 43rd-50th year of the Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plans that include the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), The Emergency Shelter/Emergency Solutions Grant Program (ESG), and the HOME Program (HOME).

Pursuant to the requirements of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, Jefferson County, Alabama is hereby publishing the Final Amended Statement of Objectives and Projected Use of Funds for this year of the Program (October 1, 2018, to September 30, 2025). This Final Amended Statement will be developed after receiving citizen comments and views at a public hearing to be held on May 27, 2025 in the Commission Conference Room of the Jefferson County Courthouse located at 716 Richard Arrington Jr Boulevard North, Birmingham, Alabama 35203.
